Highlighted Enhancements

ePrescribing transactions can no longer contain Lexi-Data IDs as of June 30, 2024.

In order to prepare your system for the Drug database switch from Lexi-Data to First Data Bank (FDB), you will be required to complete Drug and Allergy mapping. In some cases we are able to programmatically map a Lexi-Data drug to a First Data Bank Drug. In other cases there can be a one to many Lexi to FDB mapping. When this occurs you will need to select the FDB drug. In other cases there may not be any match and you can either search the FDB drug database for a match or you can map to a free text medication. These same conditions apply to Allergies.

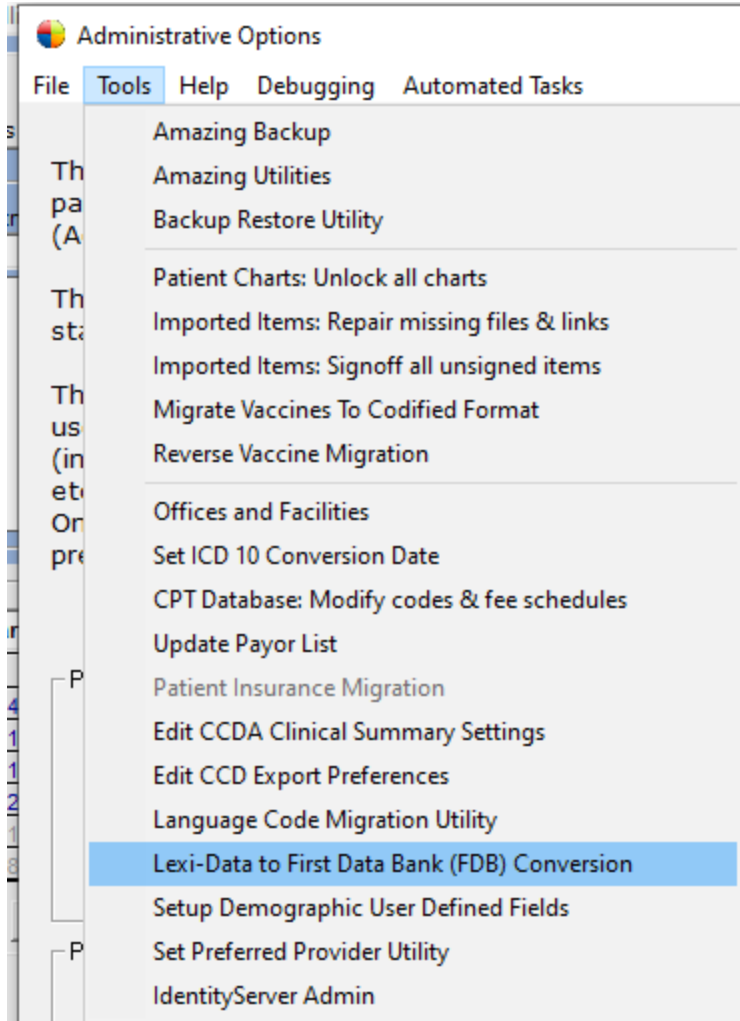
Mapping can occur as you are seeing patients or there is an administrative tool that will allow you to complete all of the mapping. Once the mapping is complete you will need to migrate all the drugs and allergies. This needs to be completed so the Drug Utilization Review can be executed along with Formulary and Decision support rules that may trigger based on Medications.

As part of the migration process patient's medication and allergy lists are updated to FDB; along with favorites and Decision support rules that have conditions for allergies and/or medications. If you have any Decision support rules with conditions for Drug class, you will need to manually update these rules. This also applies to any Saved reports that may have Drug Classes.

Prior to switching from Lexi-Data database to First Data Bank you will need to process all Renewal requests and all Rx Change requests.

Admin Tool to Map Multum to FDB Allergies and Medications AC-15237

Navigate to Administrative options and log in as the administrator. Click the Tools menu. There is a new option for Lexi-Data to First Data Bank (FDB) Conversion.

Lexi-Data to First Data Bank (FDB) Conversion

Switching to the new First Data Bank (FDB) database is required and cannot be undone once started. Please read the information below in its entirety before moving forward.

Step 1.
Process all Renewal and Rx Change Requests for all prescribers.

Do not move forward until this is completed. You will be unable to process these items after switching to the FDB database.

Step 2.

Select this checkbox to switch from Lexi-Data to First Data Bank and update your NewCrop account.

Step 3.
Map existing medications and allergies for patients to the correct option in the FDB database.

Mapping must be completed prior to prescribing new prescriptions or adding new allergies to patient's charts.

- If a direct match is found, the existing medication or allergy will be automatically mapped to the FDB version.
- If an approximate match is found, you will need to select the correct entry from the options provided. These items will be displayed in normal text in the mapping window.
- If no match can be found, you will need to search the FDB database for the correct entry. These items will be displayed in red text.
- All medications and allergies have the option to be mapped as a free text entry. If selected, these will be saved as a non-codified in the patient's chart.

Clicking Switch to FDB will open the mapping window and display all prescriptions and allergies in your database that require mapping. You may complete the mapping in bulk from this window, but completing the mapping from the patient's chart is the preferred method for most practices.

The system will begin the migration process for any 1-1 drug mappings.

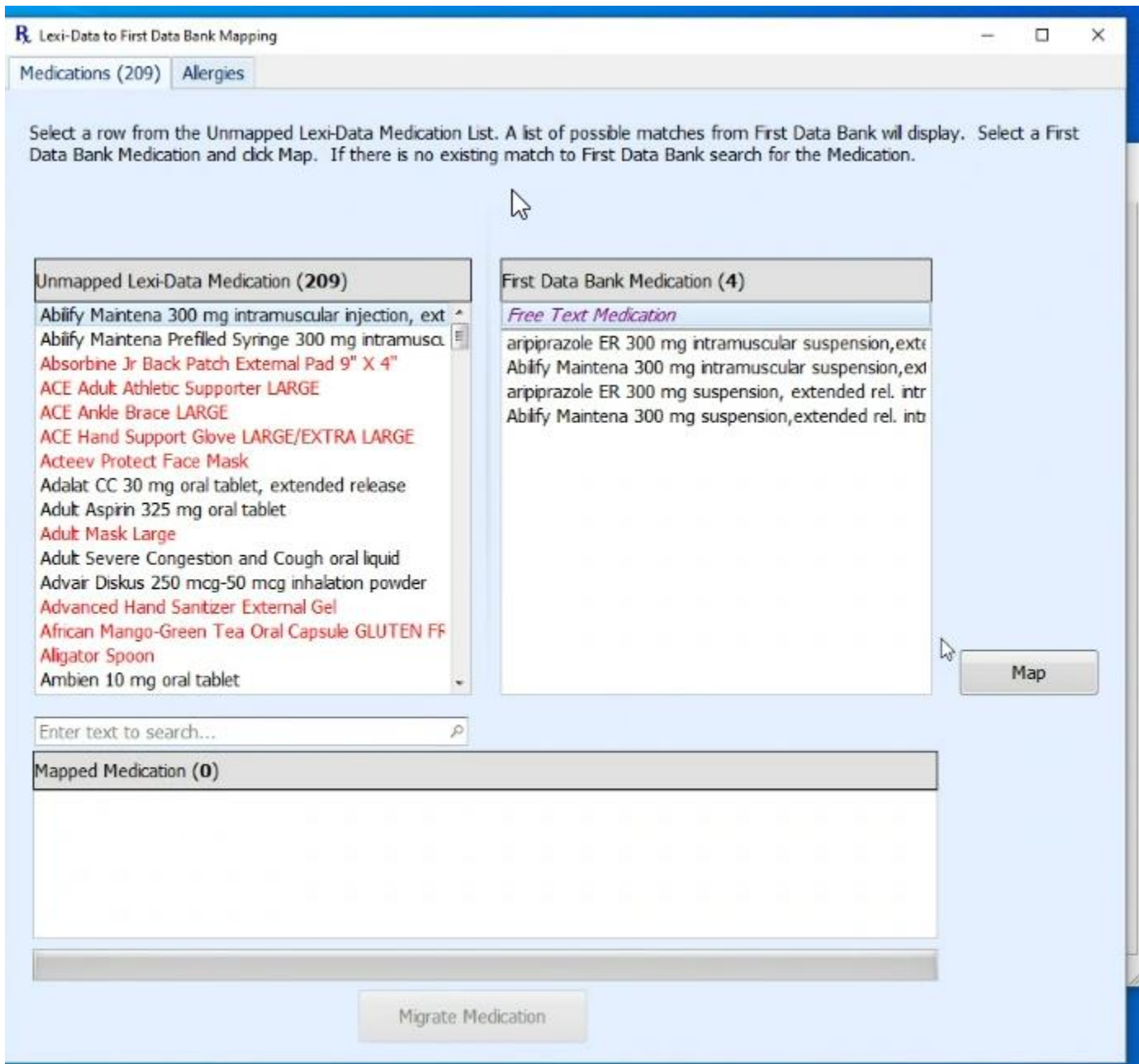
The following screen displays and lets you know the progress of the 1-1 mapping migration.

Ability to Order Pharmacies for ePrescribing AC-14355

You now have the ability to reorder the patient's preferred pharmacies. Highlight a row and click the Move up or Move down button to reorder the pharmacies. When writing a new prescription the first preferred pharmacy will be selected by default for the prescription. Once transmitted, the next time you prescribe the medication the system will use the pharmacy that was previously selected.
